## **We are helping Ukrainians!**

**CPI Property Group (CPIPG) is the largest owner of commercial real estate in the Czech Republic, Berlin and the CEE region. We have joined in the relief effort for Ukraine by launching a free store and conducting a collection of donations in the group's office buildings in Warsaw!**

The FREE UKRAINA Store was created thanks to an initiative of the residents of Rembertów, together with the help of CPIPG. It is a place that the local community is calling "a common free exchange zone." It is in the company-owned CityMarket Rembertów retail park, which is located next to the railway station. Donors can bring all of life's necessities to the store - from clothes and shoes to household items, bedding, toys and sweets. The entire assortment is displayed just like in a store, and arranged on shelves and hangers. However, the difference is that you do not have to pay for anything. In addition, one can post job advertisements on the wall in front of the entrance. The outlet is staffed by local volunteers, including CPIPG employees, who manage their own work. A profile for the store has been created on Facebook and Instagram. Using social media, volunteers share information about items that are needed and about how to collect them quickly.

Monika Olejnik-Okuniewska, Marketing & PR Director, CPIPG Poland, commented: *"Rembertów is a very vibrant community. Together, we managed to quickly launch the store, which is visited in large numbers by new residents of the district who have arrived from Ukraine. We try to respond to emerging needs on an ongoing basis, and share the things that are necessary for them to start their lives here."*

On March 8<sup>th</sup> - Women's Day, a collection of materials under the slogan "Women – and not only for Ukraine" was organized. It took place in the largest CPIPG office buildings in Warsaw: Warsaw Financial Center, office buildings on Jerozolimskie Avenue and Atrium Centrum and Atrium Plaza. The collection was carried out on behalf of the City Center District Office, and the donations were transported to a storage point in OSiR, on Polna Street. The collected aid is going in convoys to Kiev and Lviv. Employees of the office buildings donated, among other things, clothing, food and hygiene products for children, medicines, food products with a long shelf life, cosmetics and household cleaning supplies, as well as blankets and thermoses.

Ms. Olejnik-Okuniewska added: *"CPIPG employees, as well as our Tenants, have engaged with great dedication in the relief efforts for Ukraine. We would like to thank everyone for this. We are*
